Guidelines for writing paper for eJIR are given below. Please strictly follow this format to avoid unnecessary corrections, revisions or rejection. Send your paper in **Microsoft Word** format only. Your paper should be 6-8 pages including tables, graphs and pictures. Pay special attention to single line spacing, headings, and subheadings, paragraph, tabs (0.50 cm) and references. A minimum of 15 references must be included at the end of the paper.

1. INTRODUCTION (TIMES 12, UPPERCASE, BOLD)

This section should include introduction to your topic, objectives, significance, scope and other key elements. Subsection under main headings should follow the same format.

Subsection 1.1- Purpose of the Study

All subsections should be **bold** and left justified. As much possible, sections below this level should be avoided. If necessary, only 3-4 subsections should be used.

2. LITERATURE REVIEW

This section should include the discussion about the work of others in domains/areas close to theme of your own paper. The purpose of this section is to elucidate and highlight the work done by others in similar areas or domains. Your paper should reflect some level of enhancement to what has been already done.

3. METHODOLOGY

This section should include *what, where and how* of your research work. It should cover the details about location of your research work, sample size, tools you will be using (such as interviews, surveys or experiment/s) to collect data. The Research Questions (RQs) and Hypothesis (H) that will be explored and tested should also be listed here. It should also mention statistical analysis tools and technologies that will be used to analyze data. In a nutshell, this section should provide details about how you will conduct your research work.

4. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

This section should cover discussion based on the statistical analysis of data. It should include tables, graphs, pictures derived from the data analysis. This section will focus on answering Research Questions (RQs) and test results of Hypothesis (H) proposed in the previous section. Elaborate discussion about the outcomes of the research and its significance should be covered in this section.

5. CONCLUSION

This section should summarize your research in few paragraphs. It should end with listing limitations of your research work as well as future direction. It should capture the essence of the material discussed in all the previous sections.
